Malaysian Biodiesel Association (MBA)

The Persatuan Biodiesel Malaysia or the Malaysian Biodiesel Association (MBA) was established on September 2, 2008 and consist of 21 members, located in Peninsular Malaysia and Sabah. The Association was primarily established to represent the interest of the biodiesel industry in Malaysia.

VISION:

To establish a sustainable, environment-friendly and economically viable biodiesel industry in Malaysia and globally.

MISSION:

- The Association will work towards developing a strong liaison with the Malaysian Government and/or its agencies.
- The Association will work towards enhancing partnership within biodiesel industry and manufacturers, and co-operation with relevant regulatory bodies, policy makers and biodiesel related organizations.
- The Association will be the prime body to optimize and improve the competitiveness of biodiesel in the global energy markets by applying new technologies, know how and best practices.
- The Association will assist to develop and coordinate marketing campaigns to encourage the use of biodiesel globally and in particular in Malaysia.
- The Association will continue to promote the palm biodiesel globally and in particular in Malaysia.
- The Association will actively, directly and through its Members, promote the technical and operating performance of biodiesel to satisfy global standards, safety and reliability.
- The Association will facilitate the production and use of biodiesel from sustainable sources.

MEMBERSHIP:

Companies who possesses license to manufacture biodiesel in Malaysia shall be eligible to be admitted into the membership. There are two types of membership under the Association, namely:

- a) **Ordinary Member** – Any firm, company or corporation who possesses licence to manufacture biodiesel in Malaysia and currently in operations shall be eligible to be admitted as an Ordinary Member.
- b) **Associate Member** – Any firm, company or corporation who possesses licence to manufacture biodiesel in Malaysia, but not in operations shall be eligible to be admitted as an Associate Member. Associate members shall have all rights and privileges of Ordinary Members except the right to vote.
